Anti-Idling

- Vehicles that idle 10 minutes per day waste more than 29 gallons of fuel each year.
- An idling vehicle emits 20 times more pollution than one traveling at 30 miles per hour.
- Ten Seconds of idling uses more fuel than turning the engine off and on.
- Emissions are still present and harmful even when you can't see exhaust fumes.
- In winter conditions, emissions from a cold engine are more than double the normal level. Fuel consumption is also higher.
- Idling increases maintenance costs; it leaves fuel residues that contaminate motor oil and make spark plugs dirty.
- It is illegal in NJ to leave your car idling for more than 3 minutes

The Green Team challenges **YOU** to turn your car off when you are stopped for anything longer than a traffic light, do you accept?

Accepted for Recycling

Aluminum

- Aluminum cans can be crushed and separated.

Commingled Containers

Glass/ Plastic/ Metal/ Cartons

- Steel/tin cans
- Empty and crushed Milk, juice and soup cartons
- Plastic bottles and containers #1-#7
- Small plastic plant containers
- Glass container/lids
- Red Solo cups
- Ice cream containers
- Clean aluminum food containers, pie plates
- Empty shaving cream containers

Fiber

Can it be ripped? If so it is recyclable.

- Office paper, junk mail, envelopes, wrapping paper
- Newspapers and inserts preferably tied in bundles.
- Paper towel and toilet paper rolls
- Chip board from cereal, tissue, frozen food boxes
- Clean pizza containers, 6 and 12 pack beverage cartons
- Phone books and catalogs
- No oily cardboard or paper
- Paper bags
- Corrugated cardboard flattened and separated

Bulk metal, clothing, motor oil, rechargeable/button batteries also accepted at the Stillwater Recycling Center

Items **NOT accepted for Recycling** at the Stillwater Recycling Center

- Alkaline batteries are garbage
- Compact Florescent Bulbs are recyclable at Home Depot/ Lowe's.
- Antifreeze
- Bulky Rigid Plastic can be recycled for fee.
- K-cup coffee containers
- Plastic bags are recyclable at grocery stores
- Styrofoam containers are garbage. Try to reduce or reuse.
- Plastic hangers are garbage, return to store
- Plastic lawn signs.
